

Part 1

Satan's Waitin'

Movements to be played in any order. Each is started by one of the performers announcing the title to the group, as if selecting the piece for rehearsal.

LOOP 1

Words in boxes refer to keys on the Launchpad.

FREEZE:

- 1. Continue the current sound taking breaths as required, staggering them with other players
- 2. Player at the Launchpad taps the button indicated
- 3. Players walk while playing clockwise around the microphones (dotted lines on diagram) and stop at one position further round than they started (e.g. player at position 1 ends at position 2)
- 4. Player at the Launchpad taps STOP
- 5. Resume playing from the score

Satan's Waitin' (in C)


During Satan's Waitin', 'FREEZE' should be initiated once by each member of the group, at a moment of their choosing.

The initiating player holds their current sound and waits for the other players should then join in

Follow the usual 'FREEZE' instructions

The player standing at the Launchpad announces the bar from which to restart









All repetitions to be performed in a stuttering, mechanical manner; like triggered samples





Continue, improvising in a similar manner on "To Itch His Own: Take One" for approx. 30-60secs















Players in initial positions

















Part 2

An improvisation by all players on the Launchpad



Each player takes one column of buttons; each column is monophonic

Improvise a collective loop of any length

When the loop is established, gradually transform the individual parts

Later, there is a trombone solo over the loop; imagine a Looney Tunes cartoon and improvise along to it

The piece ends when a player presses STOP, then BANG
